The unid CQ station is usually very active, 24 hours a day. No other traffic than the “CQ P xx” or “CQ M xx” is heard so far. It is an odd station, first reported in March 2014. Still no idea who this is and what its purpose is.

**Any info is greatly appreciated.**

**Frequencies:** 3580/3581 and 7161 kHz. The last one is a harmonic frequency.

**Active:** 24/7, sometimes several hours to several days off the air, possibly for maintenance.  
Last heard on 3 June 2015

**Mode:** CW

**Location:** probably Siberia, more precisely West Siberia as the signal is only audible via the various Siberian remote receivers and by far the best reception is in West Siberia (Novosibirsk and Bratsk).

**Format:** CQ P xx (CQ P followed by figures 1-25). Sometimes CQ M xx is transmitted. Long zero.

**Note:**

A similar station was heard on 6472 kHz, 24-03, 1830 UTC, sending 64 E E
